The purpose of this agreement is to obtain consent from all parties with claims to the intellectual property of the work submitted before proceeding to publication in the *University of Saskatchewan Undergraduate Research Journal (USURJ)*. Consent to publication is required from the primary author (undergraduate student). 1. Introduction

USURJ is an open access, online, peer-reviewed scholarly journal featuring original work by University of Saskatchewan undergraduate students. Founded by students, the journal celebrates undergraduate contributions to research in all disciplines and professional colleges. All published content is made freely available to readers, at no charge to authors.

2. Review Process for Special Issue Submissions

The process of peer review, integral to USURJ's editorial process, allows the Editorial Board to make fair, informed assessments of potential works for publication and provides invaluable feedback to authors regarding the strengths of their article and areas requiring improvement. If your submission to our special issue, "Disrupting and Expanding the Status Quo," moves forward for review, it will undergo open, collaborative, peer review by expert guest panel members.

For each author, please supply a short biographical note of 250 words or less. Please consider including a statement of positionality. If your article moves forward for consideration, you will be introduced to the members of the expert guest panel.¹

- made a substantial contribution to the concept and design, acquisition of data or analysis or interpretation of data; AND
- drafted the work or revised it critically for important intellectual content; AND
- approved the version to be published; AND
- agreed to be accountable for all aspects of the work in ensuring that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately investigated and resolved.

In the case of multi-authored works, an undergraduate student must be the primary (first) author. Undergraduate students who contributed equally to the work and wish to share primary authorship may be listed as co-author(s) with an asterisk (*) and accompanying note indicating that primary authorship is shared.

3. Author's Rights

3b. If you are submitting anything that contains culturally sensitive information, such as certain Indigenous knowledges, please provide written approval from a community representative, such as knowledge keeper or Elder. The approval must mention the specific copyright license you wish to have on your work if it were to be published (see 3a, above). If you do not provide written approval, and if the review panel deems it necessary, they will ask you for the written approval as a condition of acceptance.

4. The Reuse of Third-Party Works

Prior to publication of the work, the author(s) will determine whether it is necessary to obtain permissions from any third party who holds rights with respect to any photographs, illustrations, drawings, text, or any other material (“third-party work”) to be published in the article. If permission is necessary, the author(s) will obtain written permission from the rights-holder prior to publication.

Copyright permission will not be necessary if the work is in the [public domain](#), or if the rights-holder has granted a Creative Commons or other license.

5. Editing and Formatting

The author authorizes USURJ to edit and to make any modifications to the work as are technically necessary or desirable. USURJ will make no material modification to the content of the work without the author’s consent.

6. Author’s Warranties

By signing this agreement, the author warrants and represents the following:

- a. the work is original;
- b. the work was created while the primary author was an undergraduate student at the University of Saskatchewan;
- c. the work adheres to USURJ Author Guidelines (listed at <https://usurj.journals.usask.ca/>);
- d. all required research ethics approvals have been granted (please see <https://vpresearch.usask.ca/researchers/ethics1.php>) if research was conducted at the University of Saskatchewan;
- e. all authors (listed above), principal investigators, and other relevant parties with claims to the intellectual property have read and consented to this agreement;
- f. the work does not contain any statements or information that is intentionally misleading or inaccurate;
- g. the work does not contain matter that is obscene, libelous, or defamatory, or otherwise unlawful;
- h. the work does not violate another’s right to privacy or other legal right, or violate any right of privacy or infringe any intellectual property rights (including without limitation

copyright, patent or trademark) or any other human, personal or other rights of any kind of any person or entity;

- i. the work submitted has not been published previously and is not currently under consideration for publication elsewhere;
- j. the work does not infringe any duty of confidentiality which the author(s) may owe to another party, or violate any contract, express or implied, that the author(s) may have entered into, and all of the institutions where the work, as reflected in the work, was performed have authorized publication;
- k. any potential and/or relevant competing financial or other interests that might be affected by publication of the work have been disclosed to USURJ.
